# PUBLIC VAPING BAN

The proposed Tobacco Bill lumps vaping and smoking together, ignoring their differences. Smoking burns tobacco and poses health risks, while vaping

heats liquid with lower risks. The Bill restricts public vaping areas, undermining responsible consumer choices for vapour products.

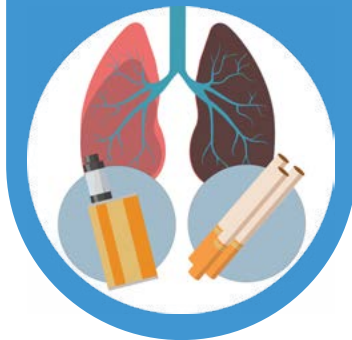
## THE CHALLENGES

- Section 2(1)(a) of the proposed Tobacco Control Bill inaccurately treats vaping and smoking as the same thing
- Section 2 (1)(d-f) of the proposed Bill interferes with private property rights



## THE SOLUTIONS

- Vaping poses minimal risks compared to smoking
- ENDS/ENNDS should have separate regulations from cigarettes as they are different
- Owners of private property should be able to determine whether and in which areas the use of ENDS/ENNDS is permitted



## THE CONSEQUENCES

- Imprisonment of minimum 3 months to 20 years and fines for specific violations\*, including but not limited to:
- Smoking in a public space or workplace
  - Smoking in a car or in a space when a non-smoker or child is present
  - Smoking in a private dwelling used by children or as a workplace



## THE KEY TAKEAWAYS

- The proposed Bill should:
- Take input from the industry
  - Differentiate between ENDS/ENNDS and tobacco products
  - Encourage responsible use and consider individual freedoms
